"Contemporary Electricity Distribution Networks - HEDNO" Vocational Master in partnership with the University of Western Macedonia, 2nd Cycle

In response to the contemporary training trends and the demand for specialized knowledge resulting from the rapid transformation and modernization of the company, HEDNO announces the start of the 2nd cycle of the Vocational Master Program.

The "Contemporary Electricity Distribution Networks - HEDNO" Vocational Master is implemented by HEDNO in partnership with the University of Western Macedonia, linking the labour market with the scientific community and offering students an integrated and multidimensional learning experience.

51 students are already participating in the first cycle of the Programme, of which 40 are employees at HEDNO.

The program's goal is to provide targeted, specialized training for the executives of HEDNO to enhance their knowledge, in harmony with today's requirements.

The duration of the program, which leads to the award of a recognized Postgraduate Diploma, is set at 14 months and includes the preparation of a Dissertation. Participants must physically attend the courses and workshops which will be held every 2 weeks at the facilities of the University of Western Macedonia, and at the schools of the HEDNO in Anoixi, Attica.

At the same time, as part of the Company's Corporate Social Responsibility, a maximum of 15 places are announced for Polytechnic School graduates or graduates of Faculties of Technological Applications of former Technological Educational
