



ANNOUNCEMENT

HEDNO would like to announce that just a while ago, the island of Skiathos was reconnected to the network after the disconnection that took place at 15:00, today, 14 February, due to damage caused by the fall of trees during the Medea weather system, at two of the three Medium Voltage lines supplying Sporades at the mainland part of the Network, at the area of Pilio.

HEDNO crews, partner contractors, the Municipality and the Fire Services worked in coordination with Civil Protection and under very difficult conditions in order to restore the damage.

HEDNO's technical crews were fully prepared to deal with the extreme weather system of Medea, having already restored a number of damages at Medium Voltage lines and a great number of individual Low Voltage damages across the country, in Central Greece, Epirus and the Peloponnese, and mainly mountain parts in areas such as Karditsa, Lamia, Volos, Trikala, Thiva, Amfissa, Ioannina, Arta etc. as well as the islands of the North Aegean.

More than 600 crews of HEDNO as well as partner contractors including about 1,500 workers have been operating across the country in order to reconnect the supply as soon as possible for all areas affected by the weather conditions.

HEDNO's entire workforce will continue their non-stop efforts to restore all Network damages that have been caused by the extreme weather system throughout the night. Please note that these restoration works are extremely difficult in many cases, particularly at mountainous areas due to road network access problems.
